Year (TY) Student Education and Career Information Placements

in a Health Care Setting

Dear Colleagues

This memo provides a summary of the key guidance governing Transition Year (TY) Education and Career Information Placements across our services.

TY placements are a strategically important component of the HSE's long-term workforce pipeline. By offering students structured exposure to healthcare environments and professions, these placements support informed career decision-making and help position the HSE as an employer of choice. It is therefore essential that all participating services demonstrate the highest professional standards, ensuring that students experience a safe, well-organised, and positive introduction to the health sector.

Placements are voluntary, unpaid, and observational. They may be delivered as structured programmes or arranged on an ad-hoc basis according to local capacity and service pressures. Effective delivery requires coordinated planning and clear communication between HSE sites, participating schools, and students.

A suite of standardised supports—including a Request Form, Placement Checklist, sample programme outline, and Confidentiality Agreement—has been developed to assist services in delivering high-quality, compliant placement experiences. Consistent application of these materials will enhance the reputation of HSE services and strengthen future recruitment pathways.

Senior leadership endorsement and oversight are critical to ensuring that TY placements remain aligned with organisational priorities and continue to contribute meaningfully to the development of Ireland's future health workforce.
