Re: Update on 'Be on call for Ireland'

Dear colleagues

I'm contacting you to give you an update on our 'Be on call for Ireland' campaign, which was launched on St Patrick's Day. The purpose of the campaign is to target health care workers and clinicians not currently working within the health services, in either a public or private capacity, to help the HSE during the current outbreak of COVID-19. To date, over 70,000 people have registered.

'Be on call for Ireland' aims to provide a fast track recruitment process for healthcare workers in a complex and evolving environment. We are working firstly to identify

appropriately skilled individuals for the disciplines where there currently is most need in our Services, i.e. Doctors, Nurses, Medical Laboratory staff, Health-Care Assistants and Ambulance personnel. The prioritisation remains fluid and will depend upon the evolving needs of the Services.

It should be noted that the vast majority of registrations in these priority categories are from individuals who are already working within the Health Services; therefore our initial focus is to concentrate on those who would be new to the Services.

Concurrently, we are finalising the deployment mechanism to allow Services to access those who have been recruited through the "Be on call for Ireland" initiative, and this information will be shared with you shortly.

In the meantime, I would urge you to continue to maximize the capacity of existing staff, including exploring if part-time employees are willing to increase their working hours, and determining if employees/agency staff have skills which can be better utilised in more critical areas. I would encourage you to engage with health workers who you may know that are currently not working, to see if they would be willing to return to work with us during the current outbreak. Finally, I would advise you to maximise agency staff with your existing framework agencies.

I will be in touch with more information on the 'Be on call for Ireland' initiative shortly.
